

Early Years Studies Foundation Degree

Ideal if: you already have an Early Years qualification at Level 3 and want to increase your knowledge.

You'll learn: a variety of mandatory units including emerging developmental theory and research and leading and managing in the Early Years sector.

Expect to: develop your ability as a reflective practitioner, by exploring links between theoretical perspectives and current practice and learn how to think critically about current policy.

You'll love: still having the opportunity to work while putting what you learn into practice.

This 2 year full-time course is ideal if you already have an Early Years qualification at Level 3 and want to increase your knowledge. It is an ideal course for students who have a classroom assistant qualification who now want to learn more about children and their families. Students need to demonstrate they have previous experience with working with children before embarking on this Level 4 Foundation Degree.

The course, which is validated by the University of Gloucestershire, takes place over two evenings a week and one of these evenings is delivered electronically through web based activities and webinars. In addition, there are also three innovative learning weekends.

If you're not quite sure whether you can afford the time or the money to go onto a full degree course at a University, but still want to work towards that goal, then a Foundation Degree is the option for you. By enrolling onto a Foundation Degree you will still have the opportunity to work and put what you learn into practice.

All entrants must be employed (or undertaking substantial voluntary work) in the sector for the duration of the course.

An enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service Check is required. You must also be computer literate and have internet access and a PC with microphone and headphones to take part in webinar learning. This course must be applied for through UCAS.

What's Next

On successful completion of your course you can apply to the University of Gloucestershire to complete a third year to obtain a Bachelors Degree in Early Childhood Studies. In order to apply for this qualification you will also need to have achieved a minimum of grade C in GCSE Maths and English.

Completion of this course could support your progression on to nursery management.

Students wishing to progress into teaching and gain Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) would need to complete the BA Early Childhood Studies course before taking a Post Graduate Certificate of Education (PGCE) which comes with its own entry requirements. You will be able to discuss this during the final year of your Bachelors Degree as these requirements are under constant review by the Training and Development Agency for Schools.
